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

Have you ever wondered what God is like? God is so great and so wonderful that we can never know all about Him. But God has given us a wonderful book that tells us about Himself.

In the next two sections we will learn about what God is like. God is not like any other being in the universe. In this Section we will look at five "attributes" of God. An attribute is any way God has at all revealed Himself to us in His Word. God's attributes cannot be counted and never change.

God Personal Being

There is only one God—the true and living God. He said, "I am the Lord, and there is no other; There is no God besides Me..." (Isaiah 45:5).

Some people think that there are many gods. But in the Bible, God tells us there is only one true and living God. He says, "I am God, and there is no other; I am God, and there is none like Me."

God is not a "force." God is a personal God who knows and loves every one of us. God is pleased when we want to know Him. Above all, God wants us to love Him with all our heart.

God shows us in many ways that He is a personal God. He speaks to us in the Bible. He listens to us when we pray. He wants us to love Him. He tells us in His Word that there is no god besides Him. He is the one true and living God.

God is Spirit

Although God is a personal

Being, He does not have a body like we have. God is Spirit. We cannot see that which is spirit. When God made you, He gave you a body. He also gave you a spirit. Your spirit lives in your body. Other people can see your body, but they cannot see your spirit.

God is all Spirit. That is why we cannot see Him. God tells us not to make any images to represent Him. God tells us not to worship any image. The Bible says, "God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth" (John 4:24).

Though we cannot see Him, God is the one true and living God. He wants us to know Him. When we know God, we will love Him. And when we love Him, we



will want to obey Him.

We cannot see God, but He always sees us. The Bible says He knows us better than we know ourselves.



God Glorious

God's glory is so bright that we cannot look at Him. We cannot look at the sun very long when it is shining brightly. It hurts our eyes. If we were to look at it very long, we would lose our sight.

God's glory is much brighter than the sun. This is why we cannot look at Him. God said, "...No man shall see Me, and live" (Exodus 33:20).



One day Moses asked a special favor of God. He said, "Please, show me Your glory" (Exodus 33:18).

God said to Moses, "You cannot see My face because no man can see Me and live. But I will hide you in the rocks, and then I will pass by you."

Moses went up on the mountain alone. God hid him between the rocks. Then God caused His glory to pass by Moses. Moses did not see God, but he saw a little bit of God's glory, and it made his face shine brightly.

When Moses came down

from the mountain, his face was so bright that the people were afraid of him. It is no wonder that Moses

God is Holy

This means that God is pure and perfect and without any sin at all. In the Bible, darkness sometimes stands for sin. The Bible says of God, "God is light and in Him is no darkness [no sin] at all" (1 John 1:5).

God is all light and glory.

God is pure. God never sins. God always does what is good and right. Nothing sinful can ever come into God's presence. The Bible says, "For the Lord our God is holy" (Psalm 99:9).

God once spoke in a vision to a prophet named Isaiah. A vision is like a dream. Isaiah saw a vision of God on His throne. Around His throne were many angels, praising God and saying, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of His glory!" (Isaiah 6:3).

When Isaiah saw this vision of God, he was afraid. The vision showed him that he was a sinner and that God is holy.

God is Love

This means that God loves us and wants only what is best for us.

How do we know that God loves us? We know two ways:

- **God said so.** In His Word God says, "...I have loved you with an everlasting love..." (Jeremiah 31:3).
- God gave His Son to take the punishment for our sins.

God showed His great love

for us by giving His Son, the Lord Jesus, to die on the cross for our sins—the bad things we have said and done. The Bible says, "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8).

You may be thinking, "Does God know about all the bad things I have said and done?" Yes, God knows all about them, but He still loves you with all His heart. He loves you every minute of your life.

The Lord Jesus died for MY sins. He died for YOUR sins. But He did not stay dead. He rose from the grave on the third day. He is our living Savior! God wants you to believe on Him as the One who died for your sins and rose again to be your Savior.

Do you know what God wants you to do most of all?

He wants you to love Him with all your heart!

It pleases God when you choose to love Him with all your heart. King David was a great man of God in the Bible. He chose to love God. He said, "I will love You, O Lord" (Psalm 18:1). This pleased God, and it will please God very much if you choose to love Him as King David did.

Did You Know?

God loved you before you were even born! The Bible says that before He created the world He knew you and loved you! (Read Psalm 139:13-16)

The Life of David Livingstone

(1813-1873)

Jesus said to His disciples, "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me."

Matthew 16:24

In 1840, an adventurous young missionary accepted the challenge to serve the Lord in a place where no missionary had ever been. In the early 1800's, the great continent of Africa loomed like a great and almost impassable jungle, full of dark hidden secrets and unbelievable dangers. But one man, chosen of God and greatly used by God, changed the history of that entire continent.

David Livingstone left home in Scotland to become a doctor, explorer and discoverer, with a strong desire to heal and to spread the Gospel. He endured hostile tribes, deadly fevers, dangerous animals, and even the slave traders who hated him so much they wanted him dead because of his work among the people. He felt led of God to use medicine along with exploring as a means of spreading the gospel of Christ.

David was born in 1813 to poor Christian parents in Blantyre, Scotland. His father was a traveling salesman, while his mother raised the family. At the age of ten, David began working in a cotton mill to help his family.

David was raised in a very devout church-going family. As a teenager, his heart was moved to trust Christ as Lord and Savior.



Afterwards, he felt the Lord calling him into full-time missionary service as a doctor. Consecrating himself fully to the work, he longed to tell others about Jesus.

David studied medicine and theology at Anderson College in Glasgow, Scotland. He graduated in 1840. But before graduating, he applied to the local missionary board, was accepted and ordained.

Meanwhile, David met and was profoundly influenced by Robert Moffat, a veteran missionary to Africa, who was giving talks on missions to inspire young people to join him.

Moffat told David inspiring and thrilling stories about the evangelistic opportunities awaiting anyone willing to be a missionary in Africa. Moffat excited David's imagination even further when he gave this observation: He had "sometimes seen, in the morning sun, the smoke of a thousand villages, where no missionary had ever been." This idea captured David's heart. He was sent to South Africa as a medical missionary.

Outside of the African people, no one had ever seen most of the continent of Africa. Most Africans had never even seen a white man. But David changed that. Everywhere David went he preached the Good News and treated the sick. He gained a reputation among the people. He shared and demonstrated God's love, as no one else had done for them. And they loved him for it.
